WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME?

Identification

- Photo ID
- Birthdate** for all persons listed on the tax return
- Social Security card** or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) card or letter for all persons listed on the tax return

Education Credits & Adjustments

- Receipts for dependents' **K-12 educational expenses**
- Tuition** expenses for university, college, or technical school (Form 1089-T)
- Interest statement** for student loans (Form 1098-E)

Additional documents

- Previous year's **tax return**
- Direct deposit information: **Voided check** or routing and account number
- Receipts for **charitable donations**
- Receipts for **medical expenses**

Income and public benefits statements

- Income statements or **W-2s** for each job
- All 1099 forms received
- Year-end income** for SSI, veterans' benefits, workers' compensation, and other statements, such as stocks, pensions, interest, and any other documents showing taxes withheld
- Health insurance card** and form 1095-A (if you received a health care tax credit)
- Health insurance exemption certificate number

Additional documents

- Child care expenses:** provider name, address, Tax ID, or Social Security number
- Property taxes: homeowner** statements: mortgage interest statement (Form 1098), statement of property tax payable in 2016

If married and filing a joint return, both spouses will need to sign forms.

Who qualifies for the EITC?

If you worked in 2017 and made less than \$54,000, you may qualify.

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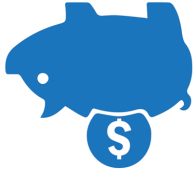
